The third **GAINS Global Trial Forum** took place on 13-September, 2021. Just as previous forums, the feedback was extremely positive. There were three trials presented, and very engaging and robust discussion followed each presentation:

Kazunori Toyoda, from the National Cerebral and Cardiovascular Center in Osaka, Japan, shared:

Tenecteplase versus alteplase For LArge Vessel Occlusion Recanalization (T-FLAVOR) Results from T-FLAVOR are essential for the future approval of tenecteplase in Japan.

Rohit Bhatia, from All India Institute of Medical Sciences in New Delhi, India, presented STENOSIS: Longterm Single versus Dual Antiplatelet Therapy In Patients With Ischemic Stroke due to Intracranial Atherosclerotic Disease: A Randomized Trial

Alastair Webb, from the Wolfson Centre for the Prevention of Stroke and Dementia, Oxford, UK, shared his proposal:

SHARPS-SVDs: A Master protocol Phase II, randomized, placebo-controlled trial.
